

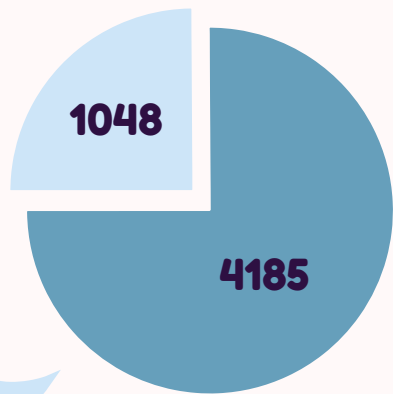

PALS COHORT

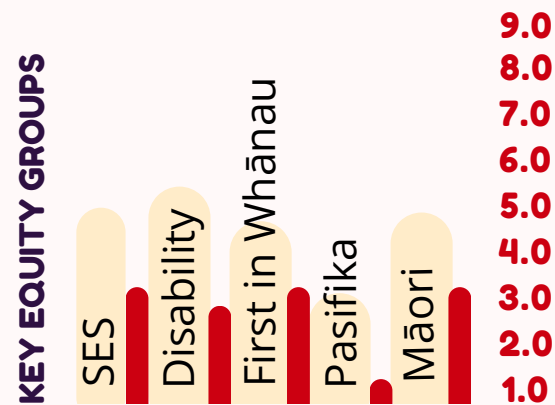


25% of eligible students attended at least 1 session

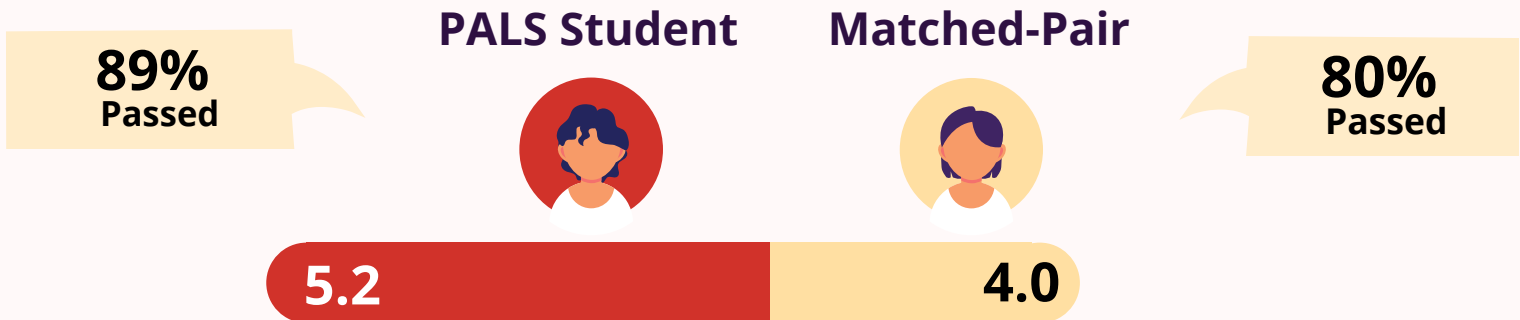

PALS students were found to have a statistically higher mean course GPA when compared to a control group of matched-pair students
