

## Phoneme segmentation

Example: Picture with a horse and four carrots.

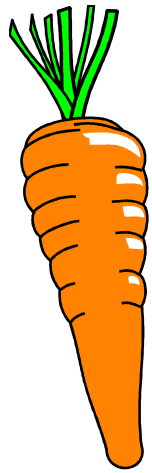
Place some coloured blocks at the top of one side of the picture. Introduce the picture by talking about being on a farm.

*Here is a picture of a horse on a farm. He'd like some carrots to eat. I'll say a word and I want you to show me how many sounds are in the word. We'll give the horse one carrot for each sound we hear.*

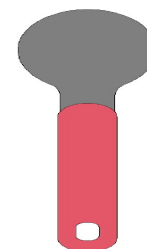
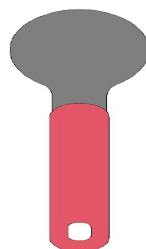
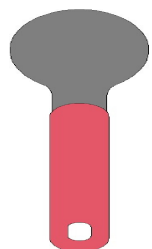
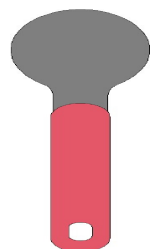
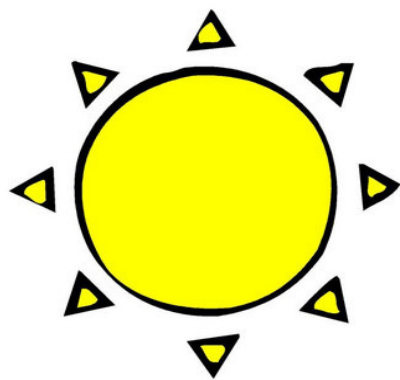
*This horse lives in a **barn**. How many sounds can you hear in the word barn?

Suggested words to segment: farm, pet, eat, barn, horse, food, hay, run

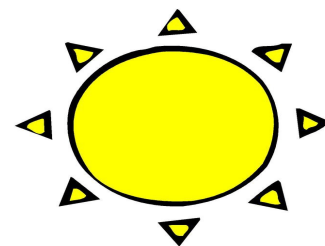
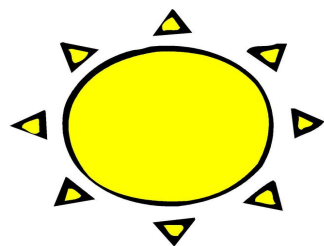
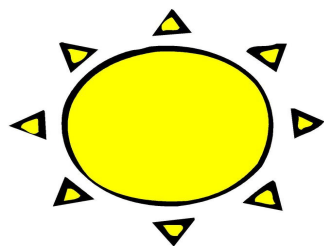
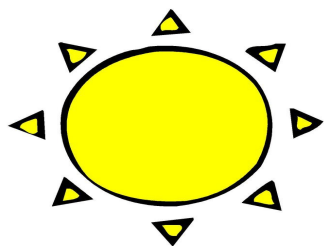
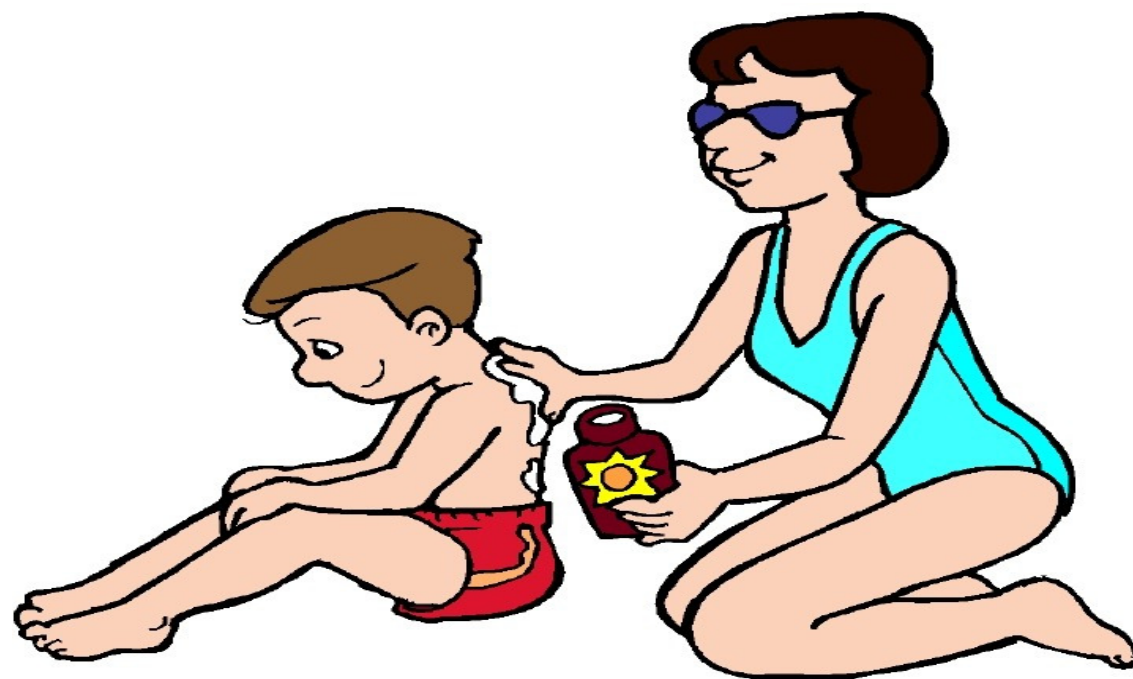
